- To aid students in developing an ethical foundation to enable them to carry out independent and informed decision-making.

Graduation Requirements

To obtain a Master of Education in Curricula Methods of Teaching Islamic Education, the student must successfully complete 33 credit hours, with a minimum (CGPA) of 3 out of 4.

- Submit a research thesis which meets the ethical standards set by the University, in order to be awarded a Master of Education in Curricula and Methods of Teaching Islamic Education.
